EVEN AS NCP (SP) chief Sharad Pawar on Tuesday reiterated there was no need to call a special session of Parliament to discuss Operation Sindoor, his daughter and Baramati MP Supriya Sule said during her recent visit to for eign countries to brief their gov ernments about India's military operation, she found that people in those countries still fondly remember Mahatma Gandhi, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru and Indira Gandhi.

"When I led the delegation of our country to four foreign countries, the first thing people there told me was that you come from the country of Mahatma Gandhi... They said Pandit Nehru had visited their country and they still remember his speeches. Calling Indira Gandhi an iron lady, they asked me to tell us more abou her," Sule said in her speech at the NCP's 26th foundation day celebration at Balgandharva Rangmandir in Pune.

Sule said people in those countries also spoke about Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "They were all praise for Prime Minister Modi," she said. "The entire delegation had the same experience in countries like Ethoipia, Egypt, South Africa and Qatar," she said, adding India has to move forward with Mahatma Gandhi's ideology.

Sule said she was fortunate to have led the country's delegation to four foreign countries.

In his speech, Pawar reiter ated there was no need to call a special Parliament session on Operation Sindoor as demanded by the opposition parties, saying there was need for secrecy in de fence matters. "When it comes to national interest, we should keep all our differences aside and remain with the nation," Pawar said. "Whichever government is in power in the country, the NCP will back it on national issues, Sule said.

Sule slammed the Hagawane family for the death of their daughter-in-law over dowry demand. "I cannot believe the Hagawane family can stoop so low. An educated family forces their daughter-in-law to end her life for dowry. What is wrong with Maharashtra? Is this the Maharashtra that we dream of? The situation is very disturbing. Isn't it our responsibility as NCF to make Maharashtra dowryfree. Are we hankering only for power? Let us start a campaigr against all social evils. Let us go around in Maharashtra. If the king is moving around in a plane, how will he know the plight of

the people," she said. She said the NCP came to power within six months of its formation. "After that it remained in power for 18 years.

# Forest panel grants clearance for Arunachal hydel project

IN A move that aligns with the Centre's push to fast-track hydropower projects in the North-East, the Environment Ministry's Forest Advisory Committee (FAC) has granted in-principle forest clearance to the 3,097-MW Etalin hydel project, which involves diversion of 1,175 hectares of forest land and felling of around 2.78 lakh trees in Arunachal Pradesh's Dibang Valley and has long been at the

centre of protests. The Etalin project is among the largest proposed hydropower projects in India in terms of generation capacity.

The approval comes despite the same FAC raising biodiversity and wildlife concerns in 2022, when it had rejected the proposal and directed the state to conduct fresh biodiversity and cumulative impact assessments for the Dibang river basin.

This time, however, the FAC granted approval based on existing studies, overlooking its own recommendations made in December 2022.

The project will be a run-ofthe-river one, which does not involve storage, and is proposed to be constructed on Dri river and Talo river, the local name for Dibang, in the state's biodiverse Dibang valley.

The appraisal of the project has been underway since 2014 and the FAC had discussed it six times between 2015 and 2022.

erations held with the state government, regional office of the Environment Ministry and said it had examined ecological, social and economic aspects and issues related to wildlife as well as the project's cumulative im-

It said that the submissions made by the state forest department on these concerns were found satisfactory and hence, it recommended grant of in-principle approval, subject to general, standard and specific conditions.

The forest area of over 1,000 hectares required for the project is mostly community forest, and it has faced continued resistance from the Idu Mishmi community. The area is home to tigers, leopards, snow leopards, black bears, alpine musk deer, Mishmi takin, and about 680 bird species.

The FAC had rejected the project in December 2022 primarily on two grounds. One, the project was originally submitted in 2014 and FAC said it was imperative to review the facts and figures presented, especially regarding tree felling. Secondly, owing to the biodiversity and wildlife protection concerns raised, a sub-committee of the FAC had recommended further assessments and safeguards.

This included a multi-seasonal replicate biodiversity study, as was already directed by FAC in 2017, and a cumulative impact assessment, since multiple hydroelectric projects are planned in Dibang valley. A stead of a multi-season biodiversity study, was carried out by the Wildlife Institute of India and submitted in 2019. However, since it was carried out over just four months, the FAC sub-committee had insisted on the multiple-season study again in December 2022.

The WII study was also heavily panned by 29 independent Indian conservationists in a peerreviewed paper for inaccurate wildlife documentation, scientific deficiencies among other things. Specifically, the WII study had reported a species of African bat and long-tailed house bat, not found in India.

Minutes of the FAC's 26 May meeting as well as documents submitted to the Centre show that the FAC relied on the existing WII study, as well as the existing cumulative impact assessment

"It has been found that there is no change in the baseline conditions in the area since the submission of the wildlife conservation plan. Therefore, the wildlife conservation plan is applicable in present circumstances. However, the cost of the plan has been revised," the Arunachal Pradesh forest department submitted to the FAC, in response to the Centre's queries on applicability of the WII study in present

Senior officials of the Environment Ministry, who are part of the FAC, did not respond to queries regarding the rationale behind recommending forfresh studies.

Regarding the multi-seasonal biodiversity study, the state government submitted to the FAC that, "WII in its report has mentioned that they have conducted field surveys with sampling replicates covering multiple seasons." However, the minutes did not expand further. On cumulative impact assessments and carrying capacity studies for the Dibang river basin, the FAC noted that they have completed in the past and all hydroelectric projects were planned taking into account the recommendations.

In the specific conditions laid down, the FAC has directed the state government to constitute a committee of regional conservator of forests, divisional forest officer and a representative of the developer to oversee implementation of wildlife management plan. It has also said that ecological flows should be maintained as per the carrying capacity study of the river basin.

The Etalin project was earlier being executed through a joint venture of Jindal Power Limited and Arunachal govern-Hydro Development Corporation called Etalin Hydro Electric Power Company Ltd (EHEPCL). In 2023, Satluj Jal Vidyut Nigam took control of Etalin and four other projects after signing an agreement with the Arunachal government. In fact, the WII study prepared earlier was funded by EHEPCL

# No decision yet on committee's advice to shift three 'raised' tigers

AS OFFICIALS in Jaipur and Delhi dithered over implementing the recommendations of the technical committee formed last month after the second human death in Ranthambhore since April, an vet-to-be-identified tiger killed a 70-year-old chowkidar of a temple inside the tiger reserve on Monday

In less than three months, the three fatal attacks on humans took place within a radius of less than 500 metres inside Ranthambhore.

Following the first two fatal attacks - one on April 16 by subadult tigress Kankati and another on May 11 by Kankati and her unnamed male sibling – a technical committee constituted to examine the issue concluded that the three sub-adult cubs of tigress Arrowhead, on live bait support since July 2023, have become habituated to people and should be shifted from Ranthambhore.

On May 14, Kankati was spotted in a millet field outside the tiger reserve where the forest staff tranquilised her. Once the tigress was placed in an enclosure in Ranthambhore's Talda, nobody was in a hurry to act on the technical committee's recommendation for her two siblings.

Early Monday, Radheshyam Mali, a chowkidar of the Jain Mandir. located close to the Ganesh temple inside the Ranthambore fort, went to relieve himself outside the guard post when two other chowkidars heard him scream. Later, a team of forest staff followed the trail of blood and recovered Mali's "par-



## **UNFPA** report says one in 3 adult Indians face unintended pregnancies

MASCARENHAS PUNE, JUNE 10

ONE IN three adult Indians (36%) face unintended pregnancies while 30% experience unfulfilled desire for having either more or fewer children. Notably, 23% faced Nations Population Fund's (UNFPA) 2025 State of World Population (SOWP) Report re-

leased Tuesday morning. "Vast numbers of people are unable to create the families they want," Dr Natalia Kanem, executive director of UNFPA said. "The issue is lack of choice, not desire, with major consequences for individuals and societies. That is the real fertility crisis, and the answer lies in responding to what people say they need: paid family leave, affordable fertility care, and supportive partners," Kanem said.

The report, 'The real fertility crisis: The pursuit of reproductive agency in a changing world' has called for a shift from panic over falling fertility to addressing unmet reproductive goals. SOWP 2025 underlines that millions of individuals are unable to realise their real fertility goals. This is the real crisis, not underpopulation or overpopulation. And, the answer lies in greater reproductive agency – a person's ability to make free and informed choices about sex, contraception, and starting a family.

The report draws on academic research and new data from a

14 countries, including India, The report finds that one in five persons globally expect not to have the number of children they desire. Key drivers include the prohibitive cost of parenthood, job insecurity, housing, concerns over the state of the world, and the lack of a suitable partner.

Key findings from UNFPA -YouGov Survey 2025, an online poll with 14,000 respondents, reveal multiple barriers to reproductive autonomy in India. Financial limitations are one of the biggest barriers to reproductive freedom. Nearly four in 10 say financial limitations are stopping them from having the families they want. Job insecurity (21%), housing constraints (22%), and the lack of reliable childcare (18%) are making parenthood feel out of reach. Health barriers like poor general well-being (15%), infertility (13%), are adding to the strain.

The report challenges global narratives around 'population explosion' versus 'population collapse'. Replacement-level fertility, commonly defined as 2.1 births per woman, is the rate at which a population size remains the same from one generation to the next. While India may have reached replacement-level fertility of 2.0, many people, especially women, still face significant barriers to making free and informed decisions about their reproductive lives and significant disparities persist across regions and states. These barriers create what the report identifies as India's "high fer-

According to Prof T V Sekher from the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai, the real worry is the decline in population size instead of concern over population explosion. "The possibility of population extinction is getting attention now. Low fertility is inevitable, and India is no exception. A large number of urban Indian couples prefer only one child, irrespective of boy or girl. Fertility will go down further," he said.

Dr S Iruduya Rajan, chairperson of the Institute of Migration and Development, Kerala, said, "Based on my understanding, at least 10% of couples in India face difficulties in conceiving, which is evident from the rapid increase in fertility clinics across urban areas. Additionally, around 10% of newly married young couples are uncertain about whether to have children now or delay parenthood"

In the 1970s, women on average had nearly five children. Now, they have close to two. This milestone reflects progress in health and education, but masks regional diversity in the Total Fertility Rate, which is the average number of children a woman will have in her lifetime. Andrea M Woinar, UNFPA India Representative, said that thanks to improved education and access to reproductive healthcare, India has made progress in lowering fertility rates. "However, deep inequalities persist across states, castes, and income

Row over airport videos: Delhi formally takes up matter with **US Embassy**

THE MINISTRY of External Affairs has formally raised the matter with the US Embassy in New Delhi in the wake of social media videos purportedly showing an Indian national being handcuffed and pinned to the ground at the Newark airport. The Indian Consulate in New York has also been in touch with the US authorities to ascertain the details of the incident, as per sources.

Posted on X by Indian-American entrepreneur Kunal Jain, the videos and photographs showed an unidentified young man being restrained by officers from the Port Authority Police Department (PAPD), the agency responsible for law enforcement across major transport hubs in New York and New Jersey Sunday night. Jain had tagged the Indian Embassy in Washington DC and External Affairs Minister S laishankar in his series of posts.

During a call from The Indian **Express to Port Authority Police** Department at International Airport, an officer said that "the PAPD doesn't get involved in deportations"

"The Ministry has formally raised the matter with the US Embassy in New Delhi. Our Embassy in Washington DC and the Indian Consulate in New York have also been in touch with the US authorities to ascertain the details," sources in the

"We have so far not received any details about the incident or the circumstances under which he was restrained," sources said.

## Sonam's story: From MBA dreams to sanskari bahu to murder accused

year-old Indore resident arrested in connection with the murder of her husband Raja Raghuvanshi (28), once harboured dreams of getting an MBA degree, expanding her father's plywood business, and breaking out of the regimented life set by her family.

Today, she stands accused of conspiring with Raj Kushwaha (21), whom police believe she was in a relationship with, to hire contract killers to murder Raja while they were on their honeymoon.

Sonam grew up in the narrow bylanes of Indore's Kushwah Nagar, where her father, Devi Singh Raghuvanshi, had built a plywood business over 25 years after arriving from nearby Guna with limited resources. Her family said she is a graduate and claimed she played a role in expanding her father's business.

Growing up a girl in a small town, her father says, the family kept a check on her movements and associations from a young age. "We never allowed our daughter to go out of the home and talk to random people," Devi Singh said. "She lived a strict life. Her life was only work and home."

Her family discouraged her from pursuing work outside their sphere, so she remained within the confines of the plywood factory operations.

The family's financial situation had improved considerably over the years, expanding into Gujarat under her brother Govind's management. But this prosperity came with increased restrictions on Sonam's personal freedom. "She

once mentioned wanting to pursue an MBA, but this was quietly shelved when her family made it clear that her place was within their business operations," said a senior Madhya Pradesh police officer. It was during this time that Sonam first encountered Raj, a man who had previously worked in the billing department of her father's factory and lived in the same neighbourhood. Their interaction was initially limited to routine business transactions, but the relationship would develop beyond her family's knowledge or approval. Her family members maintain they had no inkling of the relationship, and claim the police are lying.

When the time came for marriage, the arrangement followed traditional protocols. The match with Raja Raghuvanshi was initiated through the Samaj Parichay Pustika, a community matrimonial directory published during Ram Navami on October 1, 2024. There was no prior acquaintance between the families; only biodata that appeared compatible.

Raja belonged to a family that operated Raghuvanshi Transport,

a business providing rental buses to educational institutions. As the youngest of three brothers, he was involved in the family enterprise, and considered the match providential when the same proposal resurfaced after his family had initially declined it over a year ear-

lier. Raia's mother Uma said. "We were not in a hurry to get our son married. They wanted the marriage to be done in four months. We did not think much of it. She was a sanskari bahu who observed a fast for my son, did not speak much to the family and came down from the top floor to eat her meals. She was on her phone most of the time, and we never intervened." Uma said.

The wedding took place on May 11, but relatives later recalled that Sonam appeared "subdued" during the ceremonies.

Initially, there had been no family discussion about a postwedding trip, but she allegedly expressed a desire to travel. When Raja initially declined, she persisted, eventually booking tickets herself and convincing him to accompany her to Meghalaya, investigators said.

## Why Pawan Kalyan is at the centre of DMK-BJP bout over Madurai fest

A HINDU outfit's plan for a religious festival in Madurai on June 22 is at the centre of a political and legal standoff in Tamil Nadu, with BIP accusing DMKled state government of "deliberately trying to obstruct the event" after it sought to scale down the 11-day event because of concerns about crowd man-

"The venue is private and secluded. and restrictions on speakers and crowds are unnecessary. The event will be successful," BJP state chief Nainar Nagendran said on June 7, adding that ahead of polls, the "DMK fears the momentum that the event will gain".

Nagendran said the Bakthargalin Aanmeega Maanadu" (spiritual conference of Murugan devotees) being organised by the right-wing Hindu group Hindu Munnani might attract large crowds as Andhra Pradesh Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan, a popular actor, may be invited. "His massive fan base in the southern districts, coupled with the spiritual nature of the event, is likely to attract thousands of people beyond

initial estimates," he said. The event is planned on the outskirts of Madurai, with the itinerary including daily pujas, distribution of prasadam, public recitations of the Kanda Shashti Kavacham and Thiruppugazh, apart from cultural performances. In addition to Kalyan, BJP leaders are also reportedly mulling over inviting Union Home Minister Amit Shah and UP CM Yogi Adityanath, with top party sources saying Shah had already given an "informal approval" to explore his availability for the event.

According to the state secretary of the Hindu Munnani, S Muthukumar, police permission was sought to use microphones and amplifiers, but it was rejected over concerns about crowd management. He also alleged that a police team visited the site, where the miniatures were being made, and warned volunteers and artisans to stop

This is not the first time BJP has tried

to centre its Tamil Nadu outreach over Lord Murugan. In 2020, then state BJP chief LLurugan attempted to begin the Vel Yatra — modelled on the party's rath yatras in north India – from Chennai despite the state government denying permission to it.

A senior police officer told The Indian Express that red flags about crowd management emerged after the Hindu Munnani, in its first request, told the police that five lakh devotees were expected and then brought down the number to two lakh and later to 50,000 after follow-up questions regarding logistics and crowd management were asked.
