

# 310 mn flyers in India by 2018: Report

Mumbai: With India's civil aviation industry showing resilience lately, the number of air passengers in the country is likely to touch 310 million by the financial year 2018-19, says a report released by a credit rating agency on Tuesday.

At present, India is the ninth-largest aviation market in the world. It was the fastestgrowing domestic market in 2015 and remained strong in 2016 as well, the release issued by India Ratings and Research.

Between the financial years 2008 and 2016, the number of domestic passengers grew at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 8.5%. The total number of flyers including international grew at a CAGR of 8.3%.

This projection was based on the total passenger traffic reaching 274 million by financial year 2017. However, the total passenger reached only about 224 million by financial year 2016. "Pent-up demand, muted fuel prices and falling fare differences between rail and air travel are expected to drive the aviation sector growth in India over the medium to long term, the release added. TNN

# 'History-sheeters in fray for MLC polls'

Mumbai: Three candidates with serious criminal charges pending against them are contesting the two teachers' and three graduates' constituency elections in Konkan, Nashik and Amravati on party tickets.

### **GRADUATES' AND TEACHERS' SEATS**

The election will be held on February 3.

The information submitted by the 76 candidates seeking to contest elections to the five seats shows that three (4%) of the candidates have serious criminal charges like murder, cau-

furnishing false information, criminal intimidation, forgery and cheating pending against them. While one is contesting on a Congress ticket, the other is being fielded by the Shiv Sena and the third by the BSP. In all 13 have declared

criminal cases against themselves. The Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) has analysed 70 of the 76 affidavits.

Ajit Ranade, founder of ADR, said the aim is to ensure disclosure and wide publicity so that voters are aware of who their candidates are. "These are not frivolous but very serious charges," said Ranade.

# Speeding bike leaves 3 with fractured legs

Mumbai: Three sanitation workers on duty were injured when a speeding bike skidded and knocked them down at Bandra Family Court junction a little after Monday midnight.

Police said the accident happened when Saeed Sayyed (23) had taken a friend's bike for a spin and started performing stunts, with his friend riding pillion. The bike skidded while trying to overtake a car, footage from a CCTV camera shows. "As the biker lost control, it skidded and hit three pedestrians. All three suffered fracture in legs. Sayyed did not have a licence," said Bandra Kurla Complex police senior inspector Kalpana Gadekar. Sayyed (23) has been arrested. —V Narayan


According to sources, this is 25th incident of leopard falling into a well in the last three years in Ratnagiri and Sindhudurg districts.
