

Pro process in J&K to begin soon, says L-G

'Men In Uniform Will Have An Important Role'

Jammu: Jammu and Kashmir lieutenant governor (L-G) Girish Chandra Murmu on Thursday said that the election process in the newly-created Union Territory would begin soon.

"It will not continue like this," Murmu said, adding that "the process for holding the elections will come soon."

On August 5, the central government had revoked Jammu and Kashmir's special status by bifurcating Article 370 and bifurcated the state into the two Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh. J&K is a Union Territory with an assembly but no Lok Sabha.

At a police function in Reasi district, about 70 km from Jammu, Murmu said there will be an "important role" for the men in uniform in the forthcoming elections. "Elections will come. It is a Union Territory with a legislature," he said. The L-G was the chief guest of the passing-out ceremony of the 14th batch of constables of the Jammu and Kashmir Police, comprising 1,156 recruits.

Praising the J&K police, Murmu said the force had faced the challenge of terrorism very boldly. "The jawans should serve the people with utmost devotion and dedication. Jammu and Kashmir Police has faced the challenge of terrorism very boldly and made huge sacrifices."

SC upholds HC's shield from arrest for Jaising & Grover

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Thursday continued the Bombay high court order protecting senior advocates Indira Jaising and Anand Grover from arrest in connection with alleged Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) violations but sought their reply to a CBI petition challenging the HC's protective shield to them.

A bench of CJI Ranjan Gogoi and Justice Krishna Murari dismissed a PIL which had sought investigation into the affairs of NGO 'Lawyers Collective' and its founder members, Jaising and Grover on the ground that it had become infructuous as the probe agency has already taken action in accordance with law.



Indira Jaising and Anand Grover. Appearing for the CBI, solicitor general Tushar Mehta said the Bombay HC order granting the duo protection from coercive action by the

probe agency ran counter to numerous judgments of the apex court which frowned at PIL seeking investigation into the affairs of Lawyers Collective, the SC had in May sought response from the NGO but Jaising and Grover had asked them to file a petition under the FCRA in lieu of the petition would not come in the way of probe agencies to act in accordance with the law. The SC dismissed this PIL on Thursday.

Article 370: SC junks plea for interim order

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Thursday turned down the plea for an interim order on petitions challenging the decision to strip special status of J&K under Article 370 and to bifurcate the state into UTs.

A constitution bench of Justices N V Ramana, Sanjay Kishan Reddy, R Subhash Reddy, B R Gavai and Surya Kant said proceedings would be prolonged if it first heard the case on special interim order. New Delhi: With many states found to be lagging in fund utilisation on various schemes, the Ministry of Women and Child Development and NITI Aayog has decided to put in place a national framework to lay down the standard operating procedures to improve coordination between the Centre and states.

These decisions were announced at the two-day conference where states and UTs came together for a review of the implementation of various schemes pertaining to women and children. At the

'Death feast' not up to mark, family ostracised

Ratnapur: A family in Chhatargarh's Mungeli district has been ostracised for two years after its members ate a "death feast" after a 20-year-old son in the family was killed in an accident.

Santan Nitramkal, his wife and five children are barred from buying groceries or any human contact in Ghatoli Parva village. He has been meeting government officials and writing for help, but in vain.

He told TOI that under the "provision" of a death feast in their community he would have had to serve food to every member of every family in the village. "I am too poor to afford this. I served a death feast according to my means. The community announced that my family had been ostracised," he said. "Every day, I have to walk to neighboring villages to get a daily wage. There are the constant threats."

Mungeli additional SP CG Patil said the case has been filed. A probe was ordered immediately. Action can be taken in case of extortion of money, threat and beatings," he said.
